

2021 POPULATION PROFILE OF PUERTO RICANS IN THE CITY OF WATERBURY, CONNECTICUT

POPULATION COUNT

• In 2021, the city of Waterbury had the fourth largest population in the state, with a population size of 113,783.

• There were 26,296 Puerto Ricans and comprised 23% of the city's overall population. Waterbury has the third highest population count of Puerto Ricans in Connecticut.

RACE/ETHNICITY

• About 52% of the Puerto Rican population identified with two races followed by 46% who identified with one race, and 2% with three or more races.

HISPANIC/LATINO ORIGIN

• About 63% of the Hispanic/Latino population in Waterbury were Puerto Ricans followed by Dominicans (17%), Other Hispanic or Latino (12%), South Americans (8%), Central Americans (5%), and Mexicans (1%).



Educational attainment

• In 2021, about half of the Puerto Ricans (49%) accounted for the highest rate of those with 'less than a high school education' compared to Hispanics/Latinos (30%) and overall population (19%) in the city of Waterbury.

• Puerto Ricans (24%) in Waterbury had slightly higher rates of those with a 'high school education' than Hispanics/Latinos (23%) and the total population (18%).

• In 2021, Puerto Ricans (3%) in Waterbury had the lowest educational attainment rates of those with a 'bachelor's degree or more' compared to Hispanics/Latinos (13%) and the total population (18%).



School enrollment

- Pre-K to Kindergarten and high school school enrollment of Puerto Ricans was consistent with the school enrollment of the total and Hispanic populations in Waterbury.
- College or graduate school enrollment was the lowest among Puerto Ricans (14%) and Hispanic/Latinos (17%) compared to the total population (29%).

Poverty status

- In 2021, at least 36% of the Puerto Rican population lived below the poverty line in the city of Waterbury.
- The poverty rate of Puerto Ricans (36%) in Waterbury was higher than that of Hispanics/Latinos (32%) and the total population (22%).


• At least 46% of Puerto Rican children (under 18) lived in poverty in 2021. This rate was higher than the rate of Hispanic/Latino children (41%) and the total population (32%) in the city of Waterbury.

• At least 68% of Hispanic/Latina female headed households with children under 18 lived below poverty followed by Puerto Ricans (55%) and total population (46%) in the city of Waterbury.

Median household income/ food stamps

Hispanics' (48%) reliance on food stamps was higher than Puerto Ricans (43%) and total population (28%).
The median household income for Puerto Ricans (\$37,224) living in the city of Waterbury was lower than Hispanics/Latinos (\$40,702) and the total population (\$48,787).

Employment status

• The employment status of Puerto Ricans (55%) was slightly lower compared to the Hispanic/Latino (58%) and the total (56%) populations in the city of Waterbury.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

• Homeownership rates among Puerto Ricans (33%), Hispanic/Latino (31%) was lower than the city's overall population (46%).

• Mortgage burden, or those who paid at least 30% or more of their income towards mortgage payments, was higher among Hispanics (44%) and Puerto Ricans (43%) than the total population (37%).

• The median monthly mortgage payment was higher among Puerto Ricans (\$1,779) followed by Hispanics/ Latinos (\$1,721) and total population (\$1,134).

• Overall, renters outpaced home ownership in the city of Waterbury. The rate of Puerto Rican (67%) renters was consistent with Hispanics/Latinos (69%), but higher than the total population (54%).

• Rent burden, also known as tenants paying at least 30% or more of their incomes towards rents, was higher among Puerto Ricans (57%) and Hispanics/Latinos (57%) than the city's total population (49%).


• The median rent was slightly higher among Hispanic/ Latinos (\$1,100) than the overall (\$1,042) and Puerto Rican (\$1,036) populations.

HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE


• In the city of Waterbury, 57% of the Puerto Rican population relied on public insurance coverage, this was higher than the city's overall population (56%) and Hispanic/Latinos (51%).

• The percentage of Puerto Ricans (8%) and total populations (8%) without health insurance was lower compared to Hispanic/Latinos (11%).



LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME

• A majority of Puerto Ricans (69%) residing in the city of Waterbury spoke a language other than English in their households.



Where did we get this information from?

We employ the 2021 Census Bureau's American Community Survey (1-year estimates) to examine the general trends of the entire population, including Puerto Rican and Hispanic/Latino communities. Additionally, in geographies with unavailable data, we estimate the Puerto Rican population using the harmonized 2006-2021 microdata provided by IPUMS USA (5-year estimates).
