

2021 POPULATION PROFILE OF PUERTO RICANS IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, CONNECTICUT

Population count

- In 2021, Middlesex County had the sixth largest population in the state, with a population size of 164,568. At least 5% of Connecticut's overall population resided in Middlesex County.
- In 2021, there were 5,554 Puerto Ricans residing in Middlesex County and comprised 3% of the county's overall population.

RACE/ETHNICITY

• Almost two-thirds (63%) of the Puerto Rican population in this county identified as one race and the remaining 19% as two races.


HISPANIC/LATINO ETHNICITY

• In 2021, about 51% of the Hispanic/Latino population of Middlesex County were Puerto Ricans followed by South Americans (17%), Central Americans (5%), Dominicans (4%), Other Hispanic/Latinos (2%), and Mexicans (1%).


EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

- Puerto Rican (40%) and Hispanic/Latino (15%) populations had significantly higher rates of those with 'less than a high school education' compared to the overall population (5%) in Middlesex County.
- Hispanics/Latinos (26%) Puerto Ricans (11%) had significantly lower rates of those with a 'bachelor's degree or more' compared to the total population (44%) in this county.



SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

 School enrollment of Puerto Ricans was consistent with the school enrollment of the total and Hispanic populations of Middlesex county.




POVERTY INCOME

- At least 21% of the Puerto Rican population lived below poverty in Middlesex County.
- In 2021, the poverty rate among Puerto Ricans (21%) was significantly higher than that of Hispanics/Latinos (14%) and the total population (6%) in this county.
- At least 30% of Hispanic/Latino lived in poverty, this was higher than Puerto Rican children (22%). However, both Puerto Rican were three times more likely to live below poverty compared to the total count of children under 18 (7%) in this county.
- At least 75% of the Hispanic/Latina female headed households with children under 18 lived below poverty followed by Puerto Ricans (38%) and total population (17%) in Middlesex county.

Median household income/ food stamps

- In 2021, Puerto Ricans' (39%) reliance on food stamps was almost three times higher than that of the Hispanic/Latino (14%) and significantly higher than that of the total population (8%).
- The median household income for Puerto Ricans (\$63,586) living in Middlesex County was slightly higher than Hispanics/Latinos (\$63,076) and about half lower than that of the total population (\$118,595) in Middlesex County.



EMPLOYMENT STATUS

- The employment status of Puerto Ricans (64%) and Hispanics/Latinos (68%) was slightly higher than that of the and the total population (63%) in Middlesex County.
- Unemployment was higher among Puerto Ricans (5%) and Hispanics/Latinos (5%) compared to the total population (3%) counts.


Housing Characteristics

- Homeownership rates among Puerto Ricans (56%) and Hispanics (47%) was significantly lower than that of the total population (76%) in Middlesex County.
- Middlesex's overall population (28%) paid 30% or more of their income towards mortgage payments than Puerto Ricans (12%) and Hispanics (17%).
- In 2021, the median monthly mortgage payment was higher among Hispanics/Latinos (\$1,985) followed byPuerto Ricans (\$1,921) and the total population (\$1,529) in this county.
- At least 53% of the Hispanic population were renters, this was a higher percentage than Puerto Ricans (44%) and total population (24%) residing in Middlesex County.
- Rent burden, also known as tenants paying at least 30% or more of their incomes towards rents, was higher among Hispanics (62%) followed by Puerto Ricans (53%) and the total population (48%).
- Hispanics/Latinos (\$1,308) showed higher rental rates compared to the total population (\$1,222) and Puerto Rican population (\$1,047).


HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE

- Puerto Ricans (42%) were more likely to rely on public health coverage compared to Hispanics/Latinos (30%) and the total population (33%) in Middlesex County.
- Hispanics/Latinos (11%) were less likely to have health insurance than Puerto Ricans (5%) and the total (3%) population in Middlesex County.



Language spoken at home

• A majority of Puerto Ricans (51%) residing in Middlesex County spoke a language other than English in their households.



Where did we get this information from?

We employ the 2021 Census Bureau's American Community Survey (1-year estimates) to examine the general trends of the entire population, including Puerto Rican and Hispanic/Latino communities. Additionally, in geographies with unavailable data, we estimate the Puerto Rican population using the harmonized 2006-2021 microdata provided by IPUMS USA (5-year estimates).
